would save you quite a bit of expense. I have the 1895 modle winchester ordered and Mr. Graham, also, has one ordered we have ordered two between us one of them is a 405 cal. These guns we have ordered thru a dealer here don't know what they will cost us but about \$60. each I think, I talked with the Winchester representative myself and he said we would have to pay what they was selling for when they was shipped. I think you aught to have one in a 30-50 cal. This is the regular U.S. Government cartridge, I would also take along the gun you now have.

About the Russell hunting shoes or pacs some call them other Companys make good shoes but I prefer the Russell, they will send you a catalogue and measure balnks and prices upon request.

Mr. Buman, this hunting party is now as much your as it is mine, or any one else that is going on the trip and I want you to take it that way, every man that goes will be treated fair and square as far as have any thing to do with it.
