STILL SOME CARIBOU REMAIN

Tens of thousands of caribou on their annual trek south lined both sides of the Yukon River for a distance of forty-five miles from Thistle Creek to Ogilve and river boats steamed for miles through the great herds recently, according to people from the Interior who came up the river.

Passengers on the boats say that the animals were at every bend and curve of the river and in some cases were seen swimming the stream. It is thought that they are a part of the band that were reported a short time before crossing the Glacier trail on the way toward Sixtymile.
